**PRACTICE SMART STYLE SAFETY WHEN USING FREESTYLE TERRAIN**

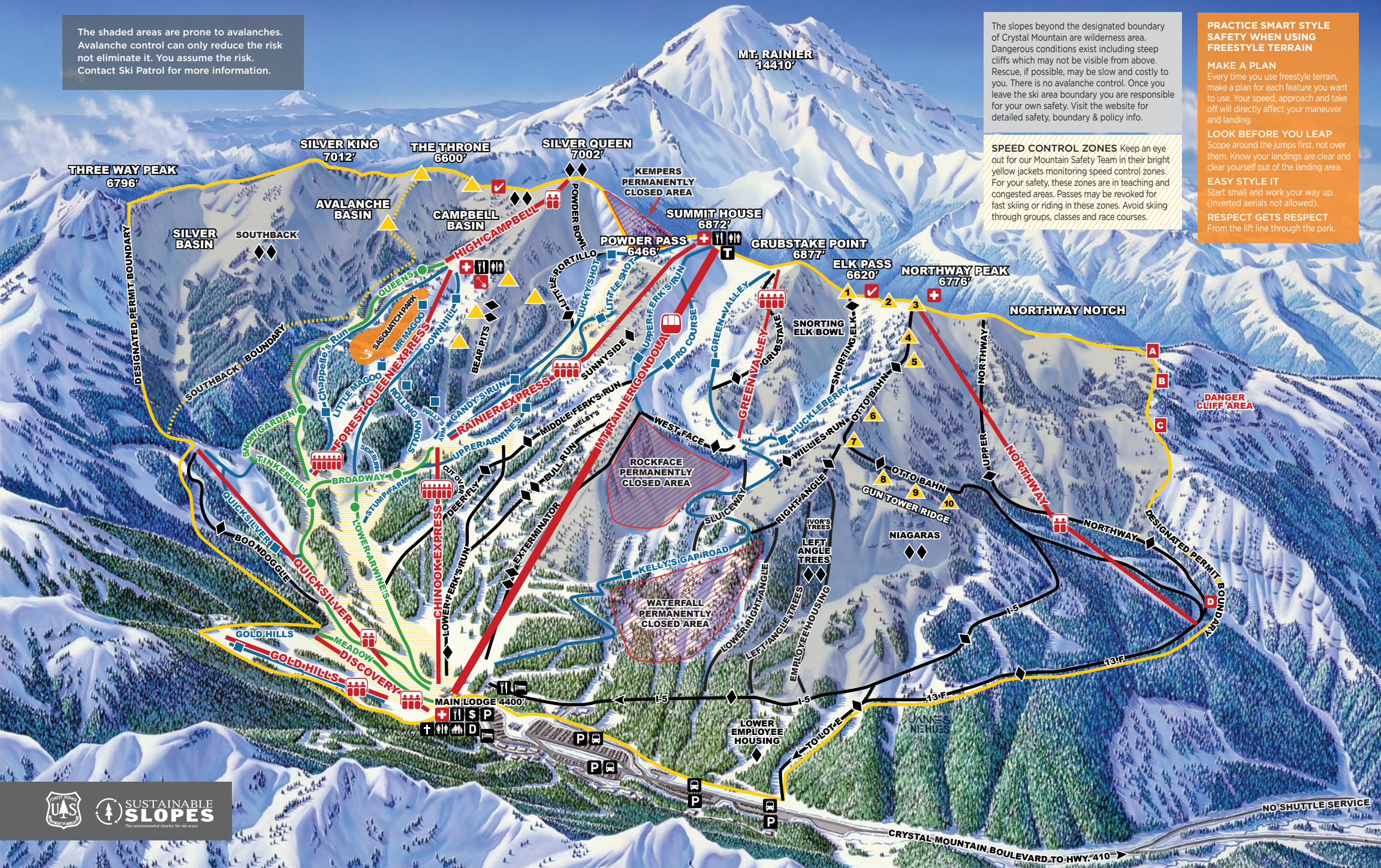
**MAKE A PLAN**  
Every time you use freestyle terrain, make a plan for each feature you want to use. Your speed, approach and take off will directly affect your maneuver and landing.

**LOOK BEFORE YOU LEAP**  
Scope around the jumps first, not over them. Know your landings are clear and clear yourself out of the landing area.

**EASY STYLE IT**  
Start small and work your way up. (Inverted aerials not allowed).

**RESPECT GETS RESPECT**  
From the lift line through the park.

**SPEED CONTROL ZONES** Keep an eye out for our Mountain Safety Team in their bright yellow jackets monitoring speed control zones. For your safety, these zones are in teaching and congested areas. Passes may be revoked for fast skiing or riding in these zones. Avoid skiing through groups, classes and race courses.
