

WARNING! VERMONT LAW STATES

That no ski area, its owners, employees, or agents shall be held responsible for ensuring the safety of or for damages, including injury or death, resulting to persons who utilize the facilities of a ski area to access terrain outside open and designated ski trails. Ski areas shall not be liable for damages, including injury or death, to persons who venture beyond such open and designated ski trails. [Sec. 83, 12 V.S.A. 1038(a).]

That a person who uses the facilities of a ski area to access terrain outside the open and designated ski trails shall be liable in a civil action brought by any person, including a ski area, rescue organization, municipality, or the State to recover expenses incurred to provide rescue, medical, or other services for circumstances or injuries which resulted from such use. [Sec. 83, 12 V.S.A. 1038(c).]

Open and designated trails are those portions of the trails posted on a daily basis, that are designated for skiing by grooming preparation or posted notice, but limited by trail markings, obvious or necessary natural and/or man-made obstacles and hazards, terrain features, or other conditions. The designated portion of any trail varies from day to day and within each day, based upon weather and trail conditions and skier use. All other areas on the mountain are not considered open and designated trails. It is up to you to know the limitations of terrain based on the changing surface conditions throughout the day. Common sense and reasonable prudence are extremely important. Stay away from trail edges and other hazardous areas.

RESORT SERVICES

Located on the main floor of the Clock Tower Base Lodge and in the Jackson Gore base area. Stop in for general assistance, resort information, season passes, gift cards and lesson reservations.

LODGING WELCOME CENTER

Located at the Clock Tower base area, just to the right of the new Edges Demo Center, the Lodging Welcome Center is open from 8 am–5:30 pm for your convenience during the regular winter season. This is where guests staying slopeside through Okemo Mountain Resort Properties check in and check out. Jackson Gore guests can check in and out right in the Jackson Gore Inn. It is also the site of next-day ticket sales and the Okemo Mountain Lodging Referral Service, where guests can inquire about lodging options in the Okemo Valley Region. BASKET CHECK

Conveniently located in the Clock Tower Base Lodge, the Basket Check allows you to securely store and have unlimited access to your personal belongings. Overnight storage is also available.

STOR-A-SKI

Daily and overnight storage for skis, poles, and snowboards is available with unlimited daily access. The Stor-A-Ski facility is located between the Clock Tower Base Lodge and the South Ridge Quad A & B chairlifts.

MOUNTAIN TOURS AND MOUNTAIN INFORMATION BOOTH

Stop by the Mountain Information Booth, located by the Sugar House Lodge, and catch up on “what’s hot” at Okemo. Mountain Ambassadors will provide updated information on snow conditions, the “trail pick of the day” and free guided tours to intermediate and advanced skiers and riders. Tours available on weekends and during holiday vacation weeks from 9 am to 2 pm. It’s a great way to acquaint yourself with Okemo’s vast lift and trail network. All that’s needed is a lift ticket or season pass to join the tour group.

CELLULAR PHONES

TRANSPORTATION

RESORT SHUTTLE SERVICE

A resort shuttle serves the rental guests and owners of Okemo Mountain Resort Properties slopeside lodging, the Jackson Gore Inn, the Clock Tower base area and the Okemo Valley Nordic Center. Dates of operation: December 10, 2011 through April 1, 2012, excluding December 25, 2011. Schedules available at the Lodging Welcome Center, located by the Okemo Clock Tower, and at the Jackson Gore Inn.

THE OKEMO VILLAGE SHUTTLE

Shuttle buses make frequent stops at convenient locations throughout the Ludlow/Proctorsville region. TERRAIN PARKS, PIPES & RACING

TERRAIN PARKS & PIPES

The Okemo Superpipe is a 500 ft. full-size superpipe. Serviced by The Pull surface lift and the Black Ridge Triple chair.

The Dew Zone Jib Park features boxes and rails varying from 10 ft. to 50 ft. in length. Serviced by The Pull surface lift and located next to the Okemo Superpipe.

Starting from the summit, the Super Park on Nor’easter is Okemo’s largest park and contains air features of varying size. Located on the Nor’easter trail and serviced by the Northstar Express Quad.

Hot Dog Hill contains a mini park, 10 ft. rails and 10 ft. air features. Located just below the Sugar House Lodge and serviced by the South Ridge Quads.

The Inn Bound Park at the Jackson Gore base has smaller features, is walk-up accessible, and is serviced by the Coleman Brook Express Quad.

The Cross Park, a family-friendly terrain park, is located on the Lower Tomahawk trail.

Black Out Park is a brand-new progression park accessible from the Black Ridge Triple, located on the Black Out trail.

Broken Arrow is graded with all-natural features made from fallen timber. For expert skiers and riders only. Located in the trees off Lower Arrow.

NASTAR RACE ARENA

Race the clock on Okemo’s NASTAR Race Arena, now located just above Bull Run beneath the South Ridge Quad A. Open Friday–Sunday from 10 am to 2 pm.

LIFT TICKET PROGRAMS AND POLICIES

LIFT TICKET LOCATIONS

Lift tickets may be purchased at the ticket windows in the Okemo Clock Tower base area, ticket windows in the Jackson Gore base area, Sugar House Lodge, Solitude Lodge, Clock Tower Resort Services and Jackson Gore Resort Services. Next-day lift tickets are available from 3 pm to closing daily.

Next-day sales are available daily after 3:00 pm at the Clock Tower and Jackson Gore Resort Services and Rental Center locations as well as the Lodging Welcome Center.

NEW! TAKE 60

This flexible replacement for the Try-Before-You-Buy, First-Hour-Free program allows skiers and riders to take the entire first hour after purchasing their lift ticket—no matter when they start their ski day—to decide if they are completely satisfied with their on-mountain experience. If they choose not to continue their day with Okemo, they can just stop by the Resort Services Desk for a return-visit coupon.

Please note: It is unlawful to access Okemo’s lifts without a valid lift ticket or season pass under Vermont’s Theft of Services Laws 13, V.S.A. 2581 & 2582. Skiing or riding without a lift ticket or pass or with a fraudulent lift ticket or pass will result in prosecution. Lift tickets are non-refundable.

LIFT TICKET POLICIES

- Okemo is not responsible for lost or stolen lift tickets.
- Okemo may void a lift ticket for inappropriate conduct by the holder to include, but not limited to: skiing/riding out of control, excessive speed, and ignoring posted signs and trail closings.
- Lift tickets are non-refundable.
- Lift tickets are not for resale and are non-transferable under Vermont Theft of Services Laws 13, V.S.A. 2581 & 2582.
- Skiing or riding without a lift ticket, or with a fraudulent lift ticket, will result in prosecution.

ON-MOUNTAIN SAFETY

SKI PATROL & FIRST AID

Strategically positioned in seven locations around the mountain, Ski Patrol and First Aid services are never far away. If you are in need of assistance, you can proceed to the nearest Patrol House, or stop by any lift and the attendant will be happy to contact the Patrol. Call via cellular phone at (802) 228-1496 daily from 8 am to 4 pm.

PARK SAFETY

All of Okemo’s parks & pipes are open to both skiers and snowboarders. Trail ratings do not apply and are not rated as to their degree of difficulty. Riders should familiarize themselves with the terrain and be aware that features may change due to grooming, weather and usage. Make sure landing areas are clear before using features. Never jump blindly—use a spotter when necessary. Use of features can be dangerous—you assume all risks of injury. Inverted aerial somersaulting maneuvers are not recommended.

TRAIL SYSTEM – ABILITY LEVELS

Skiers and riders should be advised that a ● Easier, ■ More Difficult, ◆ Most Difficult or ◆◆◆ Most Difficult (use extreme caution) trail at Okemo is not necessarily the same as a similarly rated trail at another ski area. The system is a relative system that is valid only at Okemo. Skiers and riders should work their way up, beginning with the easiest trails no matter what their ability level may be, until they are familiar with the trails at Okemo.

SKI & SNOWBOARD SAFETY – USE COURTESY & COMMON SENSE

Skiing and snowboarding are sports that challenge the human spirit and require you to remain alert and use your common sense. Ski and snowboard in control, with caution and consideration for others. Be aware of changing conditions. Natural and man-made obstacles exist within the ski area, and are inherent risks in skiing and snowboarding. Snowmobiles and other snow grooming equipment may be present on the mountain at any time. Respect closed trails and area boundary signs. These areas are closed for your protection. Be advised that while marking devices, warning devices and equipment covers are used to inform you of potential hazards, they do not guarantee your safety and will not protect you from injury. SLOW SKIING areas have been designated for beginner and congested areas. Slow down and go with the flow in these areas. We reserve the right to revoke your ticket for reckless or out-of-control skiing and snowboarding, or failure to observe rules and regulations.

In addition to Your Responsibility Code, the following tips can help reduce your risk and make for a more enjoyable experience:

- Ski and ride only in areas compatible with your ability.
- Do not take friends down slopes that are beyond their abilities.
- After falling on the slopes or lift ramp, move away quickly to avoid becoming an obstacle to others.
- When resting on a trail, move to one side to avoid blocking others.
- CAUTION—snowcats, snowmobiles and snowmaking may be encountered at any time.
- SLOW ZONES. Certain areas (highlighted on the map) are designated as SLOW ZONES. Please observe the posted slow zone areas by maintaining a speed no faster than the general flow of traffic. Fast and aggressive skiing and riding will not be tolerated.
- Look ahead and to either side of you and be prepared to stop at any time.
- Ski or ride with a buddy, especially in places where you could need help, such as in trees or deep powder.
- Ski and ride defensively. Expect the unexpected.

KIDS' SAFETY TIPS

- Make sure your child has your name and phone number of your hotel/condo and/or your cell phone written down on a piece of paper in a zipped pocket.
- Show your child what a ski patroller looks like and tell them to find one of them if they get lost.
- It is a good idea to decide which lift you will ski next so if you get separated you can meet there first.
- For a backup plan, choose a place to meet in case you are separated from each other; for example, at the mid-mountain Sugar House Lodge.

OKEMO'S HELMET POLICY

Okemo recommends helmets as a consideration for skiing and boarding participants and parents. We encourage parents and others to educate themselves about the benefits and limitations of helmets. Okemo supports individual and parental rights to choose to wear a helmet or not. And Okemo promotes responsible skiing and snowboarding behavior as the key to long term slope safety. Follow Your Responsibility Code. Helmets can be rented from our Okemo Rental Shops or purchased at our Snowsports Shop locations throughout the mountain. YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

1. Always stay in control and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
2. People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
3. You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
4. Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
5. Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
6. Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
7. Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride, and unload safely.
8. When snowshoeing be sure to stay on the side of the trail at all times and avoid snowshoeing alone.



Keep an eye out for our Mountain Safety Team wearing the bright red jackets. They will be skiing around all day to ensure everyone has a safe day and a great time. Please also watch for the Slow Skiing banners that indicate all traffic must travel in a slow and controlled manner.

OKEMO PARK SAFETY PASS

Okemo is committed to the safety of all guests that like to enjoy our freestyle terrain. An official Park Safety Program (PSP) Pass is now required to enter the Nor'easter Terrain Park, the Dew Zone, the Okemo Superpipe and the new Black Out Park. It will be recommended for entry into all other parks.

To obtain the Okemo PSP Pass you will be required to register online and take a short quiz on the basic rules of park safety and etiquette. Upon successful completion of the quiz you will be issued a certificate that you will then present to obtain your pass. Your PSP Pass will be valid for the entire season, and must be on your person before entering the parks listed above.

If you are in any of the parks listed above without a pass you will be given one warning. A second time can result in loss of skiing and riding privileges.

OKEMO OFF-TRAIL POLICY

Wooded areas between designated trails within the ski area boundary are not patrolled and have no skier/snowboarder services. If you ski/ride in wooded areas that are not designated trails, you are solely responsible for yourself. You must enter from and exit onto designated trails that are open to the public for skiing/riding. Failure to do so will result in the loss of your skiing/riding privileges. Wooded areas are recommended for expert skiers/riders, in groups of three or more. Do not ski/ride alone. Unmarked obstacles exist throughout.
