

TRAIL COURTESY AND RULES

- * Trail tickets are required for all skiers and snowshoers. Please wear your ticket visibly.
- * Mark closed trails on your map before skiing. We do not post signs or place barriers at the trailheads. Keep off closed trails.
- * Use skating technique in skating lanes only; do not skate on double-tracked trails (see legend).
- * Snowshoers are welcome on all trails but must stay off set tracks. Most snowshoe trails may be used for backcountry skiing.
- * No pets or hiking permitted. Groomed trails take many hours to prepare.
- * If you must walk, please do not walk on ski tracks. Footprints are hazardous to skiers.
- * Do not obstruct trails when stopping. If you fall, move quickly to the right. Smooth your fall mark when there is no traffic.
- * Step off the trail to allow passage of snow vehicles.
- * Descending skier has the right of way. Ski to the right.
- * Trails are rated with a degree of difficulty in regards to this area.
- * Skiing in control is your responsibility. Adjust speed and technique to conditions.
- * Maps and numbers are located at various trail junctions. The larger the number, the greater the distance to the Ski Shop.

- * In case of emergency inform Ski Shop personnel.
- * Skiing or snowshoeing before 9 a.m. is dangerous and is not permitted.
- * Return to the Ski Shop by 5 p.m.



Ski Trails (signs with yellow background)






CROSS COUNTRY SKIING AND SNOWSHOEING
