- This trail map is not to scale. It is for ready-reference only. Please refer to area trail signs for resort area information.
- Skiers and riders should be advised that a green circle, blue square or black diamond trail at Bogus Basin is not necessarily the same as a similarly rated trail at another area. The system is a relative system that is valid only at this area. Skiers and riders should work their way up beginning with the easiest trails no matter what their ability level may be, until they are familiar with the area.
- Certain areas (highlighted on the map) are designated as SLOW ZONES. Please observe the posted slow zone areas by maintaining a speed no faster than the general flow of traffic. Fast and aggressive skiing and riding will not be tolerated and your pass will be confiscated.
- Bogus Basin assumes no responsibility for skiers or riders going beyond the ski area boundary. Areas beyond the ski area boundary are not patrolled or maintained. Avalanches, unmarked obstacles and other natural hazards exist. Should you need assistance or require search and rescue service, you can be held responsible for all costs.
- The purchaser or user of the lift pass or ticket, in accordance with the Idaho Skier's Responsibility Act, Idaho Code Title 6-1106, agrees and understands that skiing and snowboarding can be hazardous. Trail conditions vary constantly because of weather changes and trail use.
- Ice, variations in terrain, moguls, rocks, forest growth and debris, lift towers, and other obstacles and hazards, including people, exist throughout the area. Snowcats, snowmobiles and snowmaking may be encountered at any time. Always stay in control and clear of this equipment.
- All poles and/or flags, fencing, signage and padding on equipment or objects or other forms of marking devices are used by the ski area to inform you of the presence or location of a potential obstacle or hazard. These markers are no guarantee of your safety and will not protect you from injury. It is part of your responsibility under Your Responsibility Code to avoid all obstacles or hazards, including those that are so marked.
- Be advised that you cannot board a lift unless you have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to negotiate or to use such lift safely, or until you have asked for and received information sufficient to enable you to load, ride and unload the lift safely.
- You may not use a lift or any ski trail when under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- You are encouraged to educate yourself on the benefits and limitations of helmets. If you choose to wear one, please ski or ride as if you are not wearing one.
