SAFETY

- + This trail map is not to scale. It is for ready-reference only. Please refer to area trail signs for resort area information.
- + Skiers and riders should be advised that a green circle, blue square or black diamond trail at Bogus Basin is not necessarily the same as a similarly rated trail at another area. The system is a relative system that is valid only at this area. Skiers and riders should work their way up beginning with the easiest trails no matter what their ability level may be, until they are familiar with the area.
- + Certain areas (highlighted on the map) are designated as SLOW ZONES. Please observe the posted slow zone areas by maintaining a speed no faster than the general flow of traffic. Fast and aggressive skiing and riding will not be tolerated and your pass will be confiscated.

- + Bogus Basin assumes no responsibility for skiers or riders going beyond the ski area boundary. Areas beyond the ski area boundary are not patrolled or maintained. Avalanches, unmarked obstacles and other natural hazards exist. Should you need assistance or require search and rescue service, you can be held responsible for all costs.
- + The purchaser or user of the lift pass or ticket, in accordance with the Idaho Skier's Responsibility Act, Idaho Code Title 6-1106, agrees and understands that skiing and snowboarding can be hazardous. Trail conditions vary constantly because of weather changes and trail use.
- + Ice, variations in terrain, moguls, rocks, forest growth and debris, lift towers, and other obstacles and hazards, including people, exist throughout the area. Snowcats, snowmobiles and snowmaking may be encountered at any time. Always stay in control and clear of this equipment.

- + All poles and/or flags, fencing, signage and padding on equipment or objects or other forms of marking devices are used by the ski area to inform you of the presence or location of a potential obstacle or hazard. These markers are no guarantee of your safety and will not protect you from injury. It is part of your responsibility under Your Responsibility Code to avoid all obstacles or hazards, including those that are so marked.
- + Be advised that you cannot board a lift unless you have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to negotiate or to use such lift safely, or until you have asked for and received information sufficient to enable you to load, ride and unload the lift safely.
- + You may not use a lift or any ski trail when under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- + You are encouraged to educate yourself on the benefits and limitations of helmets. If you choose to wear one, please ski or ride as if you are not wearing one.

- KNOW THE CODE.**
MOUNTAIN SAFETY
- It's your responsibility. Skiing and snowboarding can be enjoyed in many ways. At Bogus Basin Recreation Area you may see people using alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross country and other specialized ski equipment, such as that used by disabled or other skiers. Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes, always show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk in skiing and snowboarding that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Observe the code listed below and share with other skiers and snowboarders the responsibility for a great experience.
- + ALWAYS STAY IN CONTROL, AND BE ABLE TO STOP OR AVOID OTHER PEOPLE OR OBJECTS.
 - + PEOPLE AHEAD OF YOU HAVE THE RIGHT OF WAY. IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO AVOID THEM.
 - + YOU MUST NOT STOP WHERE YOU OBSTRUCT A TRAIL, OR ARE NOT VISIBLE FROM ABOVE.
 - + WHENEVER STARTING DOWNHILL OR MERGING INTO A TRAIL, LOOK UPHILL AND YIELD TO OTHERS.
 - + ALWAYS USE DEVICES TO HELP PREVENT RUNAWAY EQUIPMENT.
 - + OBSERVE ALL POSTED SIGNS AND WARNINGS. KEEP OFF CLOSED TRAILS AND OUT OF CLOSED AREAS.
 - + PRIOR TO USING ANY LIFT, YOU MUST HAVE THE KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITY TO LOAD, RIDE AND UNLOAD SAFELY.
- CAUTION:** Deep snow or tree wells can expose you to the risk of snow immersion injuries or fatalities. Educate yourself on how to reduce the risks and ALWAYS SKI OR RIDE WITH A PARTNER!

TERRAIN PARKS

Bogus Basin has a rich history in freestyle and the tradition continues with our three terrain parks. Each park offers different lines with varied features for all levels of freestyle skiers and riders. Visit the bogusbasin.org grooming page and snow report page for park hours, which are subject to conditions.

- Claim Jumper Terrain Park** (intermediate/ advanced)
Access from Deer Point chairlift
- Playground Freestyle Terrain Park** (intermediate/ advanced)
Access from Deer Point chairlift
- Sunshine Terrain Park** (beginner)
Access from Morning Star chairlift

TERRAIN PARK SAFETY

- + Freestyle Terrain Areas are designated with an orange oval and may contain jumps, hits, ramps, banks, fun boxes, jibs, rails, half pipes, quarter pipes, snowcross, bump terrain and other constructed or natural terrain features.
- + Freestyle Terrain has designations for size. Start small and work your way up. Designations are relative to this ski area. Prior to using Freestyle Terrain, you are responsible for familiarizing yourself with Freestyle Terrain and obeying all instructions, warnings and signs.
- + Freestyle skills require maintaining control on the ground and in the air.
- + Use of Freestyle Terrain exposes you to the risk of serious injury or death. You assume the risk.
- + Inverted aerials are NOT ALLOWED at Bogus Basin. Look Before You Leap!
- + You are responsible for inspecting Freestyle Terrain before initial use and throughout the day.
- + The features vary in size and change constantly due to snow conditions, weather, usage, grooming and time of day.
- + Do not jump blindly. Use a spotter when necessary.

RESPECT GETS RESPECT

- + Respect Freestyle Terrain and others.
- + Only one person on a feature at a time.
- + Wait your turn and call your start.
- + Always clear the landing area quickly.
- + Respect all signs and do not enter Freestyle Terrain or use features when closed.

PARK & RIDE

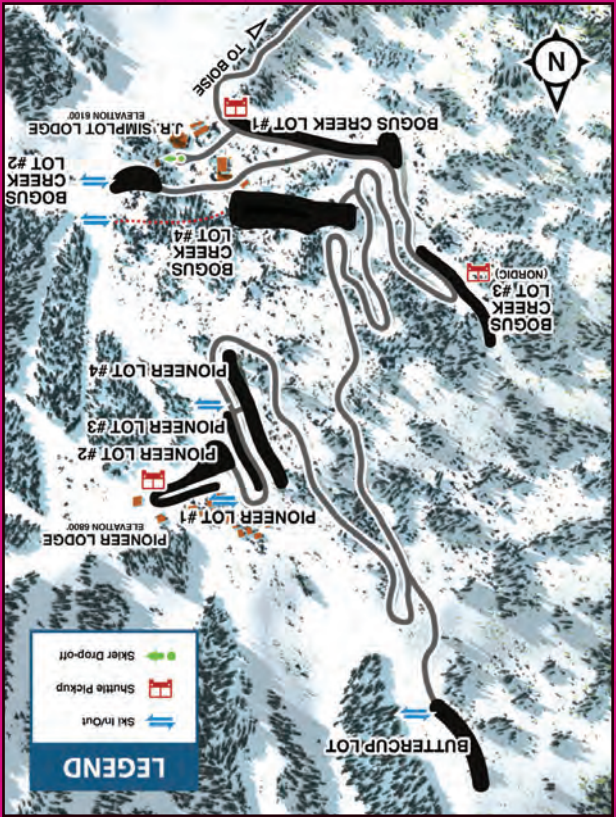

Parking lot shuttles run weekends and holidays, approximately every 20 minutes. Free shuttles loop from the J.R. Simplot Lodge, past the tubing hill to the Nordic center. During peak weekends/holidays, shuttles run to the Pioneer Lodge.
