

WAY YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

The Colorado legislature established as a matter of law that certain dangers and risks are inherent in the sport of skiing.

WARNING

Under Colorado law, a skier assumes the risk of any injury to person or property resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing and may not recover from any ski area operator for any injury resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing including: changing weather conditions, existing and changing snow conditions, bare spots. rocks, stumps, trees, collisions with natural objects, man-made objects or other skiers, variations in terrain, and the failure of skiers to ski within their own abilities. Colorado law includes cliffs, jumps, extreme and freestyle terrain in the inherent dangers and risks of skiing.

Skiing can be enjoyed in many ways. At ski areas you may see people using alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross-country, or other specialized ski equipment, such as that used by disabled or other skiers. Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes, always show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk in skiing that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Helmets may make a difference in reducing or preventing injury. Like all equipment you should make sure that you have the proper fit and that it is in proper working order. Whether you use a helmet or not, always ski responsibly and within your ability, and share with other skiers the responsibility for a great skiing experience.




