YOUR RESPONSIBILITY - COLORADO SKI SAFETY ACT The Colorado legislature established as a matter of law that

certain dangers and risks are inherent in the sport of skiing.

WARNING der Colorado law, a skier assumes the risk of any injury to pers or property resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of

skiing and may not recover from any ski area operator for any injury resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing ncluding: changing weather conditions, existing and changing snow conditions, bare spots, rocks, stumps, trees, collisions with natural objects, man-made objects or other skiers, variations in terrain, and the failure of skiers to ski within their own abilities. Colorado law includes cliffs, jumps, extreme and freestyle terrain in the inherent

dangers and risks of skiing.

Winter Park Resort strongly recommends wearing helmets for skiing and riding. Skiers and snowboarders are encouraged to educate themselves on the benefits and limitations of helmet usage. Your primary safety consideration, and obligation under Your Responsibility Code, is to ski and ride in a controlled and responsible manner.

Winter Park has zero tolerance on closed trail violations. Violator's pass will be revoked for the season. ■ Do not disembark from a chairlift except at a designated area.

Please be safety conscious and ski friendly! Snowcats, snowmobiles, snowmaking and other equipment may be encountered at any time. Stay clear. NO SLEDDING ALLOWED. Inverted aerials not recommended. Any activity other than downhill skiing or snowboarding may be prohibited or restricted within the ski area. It is your re contact Winter Park senior management for details.

Always wear sunscreen, sunglasses and a helmet or hat, even on cloudy days. Wear proper clothing to protect against frostbite.

Keep hydrated, drink plenty of fluids on a regular basis.

If you develop altitude symptoms (headache, nausea or shortness of breath) that don't disappear in a couple of days or are getting worse, call or see a doctor. **EMERGENCIES**

HIGH ALTITUDE PRECAUTIONS

IN CASE OF INJURY Do not remove the injured person's skis.

- Cross your own skis uphill from the incident and send someone to report the location, type of injury and a description of the injured skier.
- KNOW YOUR LIMITS INFORMATION Fast and/or reckless skiing and/or riding can result in injury to you or others and/or loss of your ticket.

All dogs must be on leash at Winter Park Resort and in The Village.

Winter Park discourages the use of music players and cell phones while loading and unloading lifts and while skiing and snowboarding. Caution – deep snow or tree wells can expose you to the risk of snow immersion injuries or fatalities. Educate yourself on how to reduce the risks and always ski or ride with a partner and keep them in sight especially in or near trees. If someone becomes immersed, DO NOT

leave to get help. Go directly for the airway and keep it clear. For


