

## **KIRKWOOD SKI AREA AND AVALANCHE BOUNDARIES**

Kirkwood is a unique mountain with more than two miles of ridgeline where cornices form. After snowfall or during windy conditions, an avalanche hazard may develop. Please be aware that avalanche hazards exist in avalanche starting zones and may also exist on intermediate and beginner trails below. On high hazard days, long-running avalanches may cross the lower trails. Several sections within the ski area may be closed until the hazard is minimized by avalanche control procedures. The slopes beyond the designated boundary of Kirkwood is a wilderness area, there is no avalanche control outside the ski area boundary. Dangerous conditions exist including avalanches, cliffs, unmarked obstacles and natural hazards. Once you leave the ski area boundary you are responsible for your own safety.
