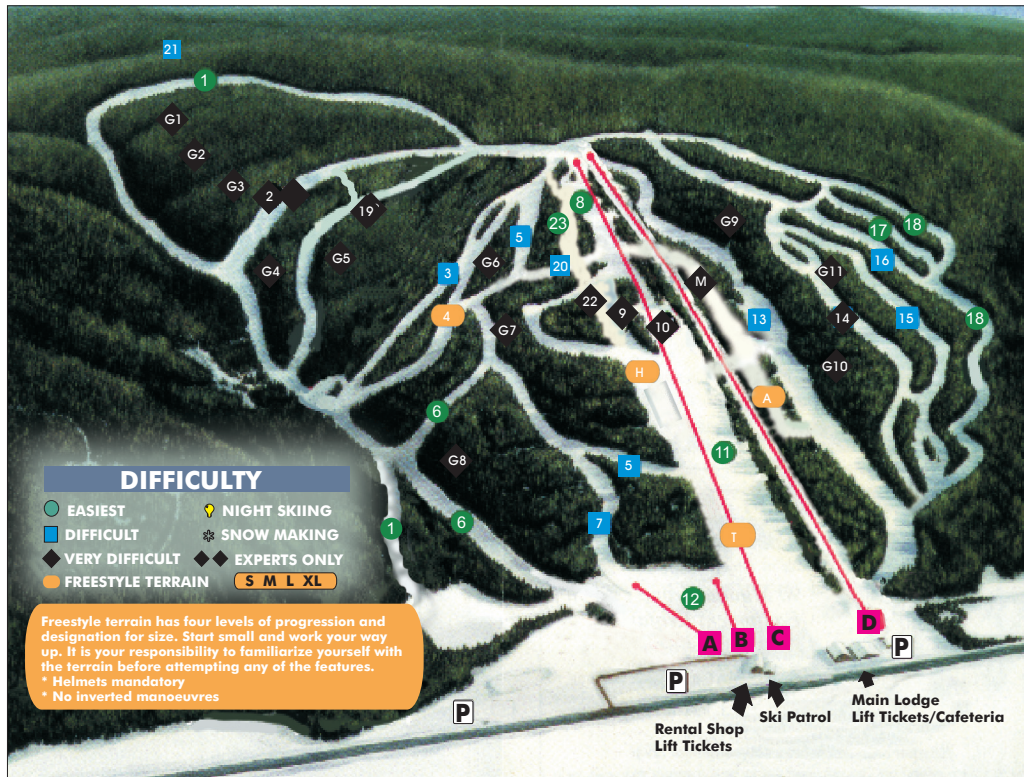

**ALPINE RESPONSIBILITY CODE**

There are elements of risk that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Regardless of how you decide to use the slopes, always show courtesy to others. Please adhere to the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a safe outdoor experience.

- 1 Always stay in control and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
- 2 People ahead of you have the right of way. It's your responsibility to avoid them.
- 3 You must not stop where you obstruct a trail, or are not visible from above.
- 4 Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- 5 If you are involved in or witness a collision you must remain at scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.
- 6 Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- 7 Observe all posted signs and warning.
- 8 Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- 9 You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through the use of drugs or alcohol.
- 10 Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely. If in doubt ask the attendant.
