

### SKI AREA BOUNDARY

Bear Valley has two types of boundary designations and signed as such:

1. Ski Area Boundary, Closed, Do Not Ski Beyond This Point. This designation is commonly referred to as a "hard boundary". These signs are used to delineate areas where the ski patrol cannot perform immediate rescue of an injured or lost skier. These signs also indicate

areas beyond the Forest Service Special Use Permit boundary. Crossing these boundaries may violate Alpine County Code and may result in the

2. Ski Area Boundary, No Ski Patrol Beyond
This Point. These signs are used in areas where rescue can be facilitated but are not regularly patrolled. These areas are commonly referred to as a "soft boundary". These areas will open and close as conditions allow. For additional information visit www.bearvalley.com.

#### TERRAIN FEATURE WARNINGS

- ✓ Trail ratings do not apply to terrain features
- ✓ Terrain features are not rated for degree of difficulty
- ✓ Inspect terrain features before use
- ✓ You are the sole judge of your ability to use any terrain feature— work your way up
- ✓ Terrain feature shapes and surface conditions change with weather and use
- ✓ Use spotters when landing area is not visible
- ✓ Do not stop on landing areas
- ✓ Use of features can be dangerous
- ✓ You assume all risks of injury or death
- ✓ Aerial somersaulting and inverts are prohibited
- ✓ Physically altering terrain features is prohibited
- While carrying boards or skis, devices (straps or brakes) are required to prevent runaway

## YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

- ✓ Always stay in control
- ✓ People ahead of you have the right of way
- ✓ Stop in a safe place for you and others
- Whenever starting downhill or merging, look uphill and yield
- Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment
- ✓ Observe signs and warnings, and keep off
- ✓ Know how to use the lifts safely
