In purchasing a ticket the purchaser recognizes such dangers, whether marked or unmarked, and realizes that falls and collisions are common and numerous and that injuries can result; and accepts the hazards of the sport and the danger of injury incident thereto, including negligence and carelessness on the part of fellow skiers; and assumes the burden of skiing under control at all times. It is with this understanding that such tickets are sold. All tickets may be revoked by the management at any time without refund.



# YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

Skiing can be enjoyed in many ways. At ski areas you may see people using alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross country and other specialized ski equipment, such as that used by disabled or other skiers. Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes, always show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk in skiing that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Observe the code listed below and share with other skiers the responsibility for a great skiing experience.

- Always stay in control.
- People ahead of you have the right of way.
- Stop in a safe place for you and others.
- Whenever starting downhill or merging, look uphill & yield.
- Use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- Observe signs and warnings, and keep off closed trails.
- Know how to use the lifts safely.

**SMART STYLE**

**FREESTYLE TERRAIN**

**Make a plan.**  
Every time you use freestyle terrain, make a plan for each feature you want to use. Your speed, approach and take off will directly affect your maneuver and landing.

**Look before you leap.**  
Scope around the jump first, not over them. Know landings are clear, and clear yourself out of the landing area.

**Easy style it.**  
Start small and work your way up. (Inverted aerials not recommended).

**Respect gets respect.**  
From the lifeline through the park.
