



WARNING! Snowbowl recommends that anyone exiting the ski area have a very strong knowledge of backcountry travel and safety equipment in avalanche terrain. U.S. Forest Service issued permits are required to enter the backcountry from within the ski area. Areas beyond the ski area boundary are unpatrolled and unmaintained. Avalanches, unmarked obstacles and other natural hazards may exist. Rescue in the backcountry, if available, will be costly and may take time. Pursuant to the Arizona Ski Safety Act, the ski area assumes no responsibility for the safety and welfare of skiers and snowboarders going beyond the ski area boundary. You are solely responsible for your own safety.

DRONE POLICY

Using drones at Snowbowl is not permitted. Those caught breaking the rules may have their drone confiscated, their skiing privileges suspended or could At all times a skier has the sole responsibility to know the range of the skier's own ability to negotiate a ski slope or trail and to ski within the limits of that ability. A skier expressly accepts the total risk of and all legal responsibility for injury to person or property resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing. Skier agrees to read and comply with all posted warnings, rules and signage. People ahead of you have the right of way. Do not stop where you obstruct a trail, or are not visible from above. Yield to others when merging into a trail. Prior to using any lift, skier must be able to load, ride and unload safely.

Under Arizona Law, a skier accepts the risk of any injury to person or property resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing, including changing weather conditions, existing and changing snow surface conditions, surface or subsurface conditions, whether marked or unmarked; collisions with natural or man-made objects, whether marked or unmarked and the
