SKI WITH CARE & CAUTION Watch for both natural and man-made obstacles. Ice, thin, or bare spots and variations of the snow surface can and do exist. Be alert to continually changing conditions. Snow, ice, sheer drop-offs, bare ground, rocks, roots, stumps, trees, lifts and snowmaking towers, ruts, bumps, and many natural and man-made objects are part of the inherent risks of all alpine activities. Falls or collisions with objects can cause catastrophic injury or death. Ski area vehicles may be in operation at any time on open terrain. DO NOT SKI/RIDE NEAR SUCH VEHICLES OR EQUIPMENT. Fences, bumpers, pads, poles, signs, ropes, and other apparatus are used as “Skier Awareness Devices.” These mark some hazards and obstacles however they are not made to protect you from injuries. Your safety is directly affected by your judgment. Failure to follow the posted Your Responsibility Code, Go with the Flow, or Park Smart programs may result in the loss of skiing/snowboarding privileges.

REPORTING SKIER COLLISIONS VERMONT LAW requires any skier/snowboarder involved in a collision with another guest to provide his/her name and permanent address to the other individual involved. Proceed to the base first aid facility to document any collision or call 802-464-4005.

SKI AREA BOUNDARY SKI/RIDE ONLY ON OPEN DESIGNATED TRAILS AND SLOPES. NEVER SKI/RIDE ALONE. Woods and backcountry areas beyond designated trails and slopes are not maintained or checked by ski area personnel. Mount Snow is not responsible for the safety of or injury, death, or damages to guests, particularly those going beyond open, designated trails or the ski area boundary (marked by the dotted yellow line on the map). VERMONT LAW provides that you are liable for all expenses of search and/or rescue off the open, designated trails or beyond the ski area boundary.

STEEP TRAIL SECTIONS Black and double-black diamond trails have very steep gradients, which may cause a fallen skier/snowboarder to slide considerably further than on other trails. SKI/RIDE ACCORDINGLY.

GO WITH THE FLOW Is designed to help skiers and riders understand the traffic patterns on the mountain. It encourages patience and understanding toward everyone’s style. There is a time and a place for speed and tricks, as well as a place for beginners. Please adjust your style so as not to stress those around you. Respect each other. Learn how to “Go with the Flow.”

TREE TERRAIN Tree skiing/snowboarding areas are not maintained or checked by ski area personnel. Ski or ride at your own risk. All tree terrain is considered most difficult and is recommended for advanced skiers/snowboarders only—use extra caution. Unmarked obstacles and other natural hazards exist throughout. Never ski/ride alone.

LEARNING AREAS Grommet, Cooper’s Junction, Beaver Hill, and Launch Pad Learning Area are the only slopes that are designated as “Learning Areas.” You should remain in these areas until you can ably control your skiing/snowboarding. Conveyors in the learning area may at times be restricted to program participants only. Long John and Deer Run are designated slow skiing/snowboarding areas.

UNMANNED AERIAL SYSTEMS POLICY Unmanned aerial drone use by guests or the media is prohibited without prior written approval of Mount Snow. Visit mountsnow.com/media-room for more information.

UPHILL TRAVEL PASS Guests are permitted to hike, snowshoe, or skin from dawn until dusk only. Please visit our Season Pass Office to obtain a pass. Remember to yield to all downhill activity.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

- Always stay in control and be able to stop or avoid other people or obstacles.
- People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
- Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- Prior to using any lift, you must have knowledge and ability to load, ride, and unload safely.
