Roadside Station Sena

The shop features a rich assortment of specialty goods and souvenirs from Hakusan City. The bakery inside, "Mountain Bakery Sena", uses natural hot spring water and plenty of vegetables and local ingredients to make healthy bread. (About 10 minutes by car from Ichirino)

Shiramine Area

(Important Preservation District for Group of Traditional Buildings)
This historical district, located in one of the heaviest snowfall areas in Japan, features a unique style of architecture. There are many houses built from the Edo period up to the 19th century, including the village headman Yamagishi's house with large ochre-colored walls and vertical windows. (About 30 minutes by car from Ichirino)

Yuki-Daruma (Snowman) Festival

Snowmen of all shapes and sizes are colorfully decorated and displayed throughout the Shiramine-Kuwajima area. When dusk approaches, the snowmen are lit up, creating a truly special atmosphere. Held in early February. (About 30 minutes by car from Ichirino)

Higashi Futakuchi Bunya Festival

A traditional bunya puppet show, "Deku no Mai", passed down for more than 350 years in the Higashi Futakuchi district, this storytelling performance entrances visitors with its unique foot tapping and bunyabushi chanting that resonates throughout the snowy mountain village.

Bunao Mountain Observation Center

This facility allows you to observe wild animals—including monkeys, Japanese serow, and golden eagles—in their natural setting. You can also see hare tracks around the lodge. A snowshoe walk is offered on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays. Open from late November to early May (Closed during the Year-end/New Year holiday) (approximately 30 minutes on foot or 5 minutes by car from Ichirino) Bunao Mountain Observation Center TEL: 076-256-7250

Kids Park

Fun, safe equipment to play on!

A Excite Slope

Advanced: Max. 30° gradient/Avg. 21° (partially compacted)

An intense, steep slope that starts at the summit of the Ichirino Onsen Ski Resort! Enjoy an invigorating, panoramic view.

G Lower Aia-Ru Slope

Beginner: Max. 17° gradient/Avg. 11°

A spacious slope that is one of the main slopes of Ichirino Onsen Ski Resort. Fun to ski or snowboard with family or friends! This slope is also open for night skiing.

B Challenge Course

Advanced: Max. 32° gradient/Avg. 30° (uncompacted course)

This "ungroomed section" is "powder heaven" when there is fresh snow at Ichirino Onsen Ski Resort.

C Upper Aia-Ru Slope

Intermediate/Advanced (partially compacted)

If you get off the Aia-Ru No. 2 Lift and go to the right, you will be in the advanced, uncompacted snow area. If you go to the left, you will be on the compacted area that joins up with the Excite Slope. Perfect for testing for skill! Also used for ski school certification testing.

D Miyasama Course

Beginner/Intermediate: Max. 23° gradient/Avg. 18°

A course for connoisseurs that extends from the Nodaira Slope! Beginners should be careful not to go too fast.

E Nodaira Slope

Beginner/Intermediate: Max. 17° gradient/Avg. 13°

Always has plenty of snow throughout the season! A fun run for everyone from beginners to experts! This is one of the main slopes of Ichirino Onsen Ski Resort.

F Rakuraku Course

Beginner/Intermediate: Max. 10° gradient/Avg. 8°

The longest wooded trail at Ichirino Onsen Ski Resort. Ski from the summit all the way to the bottom in one go!
