



GOOD THINGS TO KNOW

- Call (250) 578-5521 in the event of an emergency. Backcountry trails are not patrolled.
- When a skier behind calls out 'track,' move to the right to give the skier room to pass.
- > Fill in all sitzmarks after falling on trails.
- > Avoid walking or snowshoeing on ski-only trails.
- The Umbrella Café is a great place to stop for a quick snack or to purchase a bagged lunch.
- McGillivray Lake Outpost, open daily from 9:00am to 4:00pm, is a great place to rest and warm up.
- McGillivray Lake trail is dog friendly. Bags are provided so please clean up after your pet.

GROOMING INFORMATION

- Cross country trails are groomed and track set on a regular basis. For the most up-to-date grooming information refer to the Sun Peaks TV (Channel 3), www.sunpeaksresort.com, or call Guest Services at (250) 578-5474.
- Be aware that the trails may be groomed while you ski. If you encounter a snow cat groomer, keep skiing and find an area to pull over and step off the trails. Listen for the snow cat siren before heading down steep pitches.

SNOWSHOE TRAILS

- Sun Peaks has 12km of snowshoe trails to explore. The best access to the snowshoe trail system is at the trail head located at the base of the Morrisey Platter.
- Equipment rentals, tours, and guide books are available from the Adventure Centre.
- When crossing the cross country ski trails, please avoid stepping on the tracks and look both ways for oncoming skiers.
- Snowshoe trails are not patrolled, so please be prepared.
- › Snowshoe users are welcome at the McGillivray Lake Outpost.

TRAIL SAFETY & ETIQUETTE

- › Never ski alone.
- › Always stay to the right side of the trail.
- Pass with care and avoid cutting off other skiers.
- Descending skiers have right-of-way. Move to the right of the trail when oncoming skiers approach.
- › Take your garbage out with you.
- > Wear warm clothing; take food and water on longer trips.
