Osler Bluff Ski Club was founded in 1949 by two men whose vision included shorter lift lines and less crowded slopes. For more than 60 years, the club's progressive spirit has ensured the development of superior facilities and a wide variety of high-quality programs.

But Osler Bluff Ski Club's greatest asset is its family-oriented recreational environment. The club has developed as a truly unique family experience in which children, parents and grandparents participate together. For four generations, our club's friendly atmosphere and sense of community have made it a large family unto itself.

Features

Uncrowded slopes: Osler Bluff boasts the most skiable acreage per member of all Ontario clubs, with over 20 runs, ranging from beginner to expert, while a vertical drop of 743 feet provides skiers with some of the regions longest runs.

- Our 8-acre terrain park has a full-size half-pipe and two dozen features, including rails, boxes, jumps and hips.
- Located 10 kilometres from the Georgian Bay shoreline, at a base elevation 200 feet higher than Blue Mountain, Osler Bluff benefits from the large amounts of natural snow carried over the Escarpment by prevailing winds as they move inland.
- Osler's distance from Georgian Bay creates optimal artificial snowmaking conditions and provides comfortable skiing on sheltered runs.
- Advanced snowmaking equipment services over 80 percent of the skiable terrain, and groomers work throughout the night to create optimum snow conditions.
- The area is serviced by four lifts, including 2 high-speed detachable quad chairs. For those wanting a change of pace, over 12 kilometres of marked cross-country skiing and snowshoeing trails wind through the club's property.



Snow School & Racing

Our renowned Snow School provides programs for everyone from preschoolers to seniors, beginners to experts. Christmas camps to weekend sessions to March Break camps — we have it all!

Racing is an integral part of Osler life, from entry-level (age 7) to adult house league, and we have an extremely qualified coaching staff. Ten Osler junior racers have progressed to Canada's National Team, including six-time World Cup champion Laurie Graham, two-time Olympian Luke Sauder, and current snowboard contender Jeff Batchelor. Our racing program welcomes everyone from the young to the young at heart.



Every weekend throughout the winter, Osler hosts social events such as Friday-night buffet dinners, après-ski parties, teen dances, club dinner-dances, family fun days and barbecues. There are events for all ages in this fun-packed calendar.



Membership

Osler Bluff Ski Club is a non-profit private club with just over 1,250 member families and a solid financial standing. When children reach the age of 18, they have the option of becoming shareholders for a nominal fee. Spouses and children also become part of the Osler family, passing on the tradition. Osler now has four generations of skiing families.

Membership provides a valuable endowment for future generations who wish to enjoy a superior quality of skiing, snowboarding and social activity. We do not plan to increase our membership base, but we do accept new members annually to replace attrition. Our introductory member program allows families to enjoy all of the club's amenities and programs for one season to ensure Osler is the right fit for you.



ALPINE RESPONSIBILITY CODE

There are elements of risk that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Regardless of how you decide to use the slopes, always show courtesy to others. Please adhere to the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a safe outdoor experience.

- 1. Always stay in control. You must be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
- 2. People ahead of you have the right-of-way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- 3. Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
- 4. Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.
- Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- 7. Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.
- 8. Keep off closed trails and closed areas.
- You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs.
- You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.

The Ticket Holder agrees that the Ski Area Operator shall not be liable for any such personal injury, death or property loss and releases the Ski Area Operator and waives all claims with respect thereto. The Ticket Holder agrees that any litigation involving the Ski Area Operator shall be brought solely within the Province of Ontario and shall be within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of the Province of Ontario. The Ticket Holder further agrees that these conditions and any rights, duties and obligations as between the Ski Area Operator and the Ticket Holder shall be governed by and interpreted solely in accordance with the laws of the Province of Ontario and no other jurisdiction.
