LIFT TICKET LOCATIONS

Lift tickets may be purchased at the ticket windows inside the lower level of the base lodge, and our online store at <http://store.magicmtn.com>.

ADMINISTRATION/SEASON PASS OFFICE

The administration offices are located through the door marked Office from the enclosed breezeway outside of the base lodge.

SKI PATROL & FIRST AID

Ski Patrol and First Aid is located in the base area on the bottom level of the building located behind the Black Chair lift and also at the top of the Black Chair Lift. For assistance from ski Patrol/First Aid go to one of the following locations: Any lift attendant, ticket office, the patrol buildings or call 802.824.5645.

RESTROOMS

Men's and Women's restrooms are located in the upper level of the base lodge and the basement of the base lodge.

LOST & FOUND

Lost and Found is located at the ticket window inside the lower level of the base lodge or by calling 802.824.5645.

RENTALS

Rentals is located in the basement of the base lodge accessed from the skier drop off area or via the stairwell from the snow sports Learning Center. Rentals must first be purchased at the ticket window locations.

LOCKERS & STORAGE AREAS

Lockers and storage areas are located in the lower level of the base lodge. We ask that guests respect the property and spaces of others and attempt to use storage areas and lockers when possible. Magic Mountain is not responsible for items left unattended on our property.

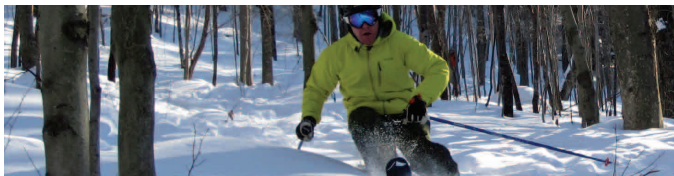
MOUNTAIN POLICIES

LIFT TICKET POLICIES

- Lift tickets are not for resale and are non-transferable
- Lift tickets are not refundable
- Magic Mountain reserves the right to void a lift ticket for conduct detrimental to the safety and enjoyment of other guests.
- Magic Mountain is not responsible for lost or stolen lift tickets.

WOODS & UNMARKED SKIING AND RIDING POLICY

1. Only ski or ride in the woods with groups of three or more.
2. Woods are not marked trails and contain natural hazards.
3. Do not access woods via closed trails. Enter from open trails only.
4. It is recommended that only expert skier and riders enter glades or off piste areas
5. Please remain within the ski area boundary.
6. Magic Mountain is not responsible for the safety of guests skiing or riding off designated trails.



WARNING TO SKIERS AND RIDERS:

Downhill Skiing and snowboarding, like many other sports, contains inherent risks including, but not limited to, the risk of personal injury or death, or property damage, which may be caused by variation in the terrain or weather conditions, surface or subsurface snow, ice, bare spots or areas of thin cover, moguls, ruts, bumps; other persons using the facilities; and rocks, forest growth, debris, branches, trees, roots, stumps or other natural objects or man-made objects that are incidental to the provision or maintenance of a ski facility. The law provides that skiers and riders should educate themselves about, and understand, the risks inherent to the sports of skiing and snowboarding.

If you are not willing to assume all of these risks and abide by these duties, you must not participate in skiing at this area.

Acceptance of Inherent Risks

Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1036 of this title, a person who takes part in any sport accepts as a matter of law the dangers that inhere therein insofar as they are obvious and necessary. [12 V.S.A. 1037]

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

Skiing can be enjoyed in many ways. At ski areas you may see people using alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross country and other specialized ski equipment, such as that used by disabled or other skiers. Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes, always show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk in skiing that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Observe the code listed below and share with other skiers the responsibility for a great skiing experience.

- Always stay in control, and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
- People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- You must not stop where you obstruct a trail, or are not visible from above.
- Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.
