

## QUECHEE SKI AREA Woods Skiing Policy

#### SKIING AND RIDING **OFF DESIGNATED TRAILS:**

If you ski or ride off the groomed trails, or in the woods, you leave the open and designated trails at our Club. The Quechee Lakes Landowners' Association is not responsible for any damage or injury to any person who utilizes the ski area facilities to access terrain outside the open and designated trails. [12 V.S.A. 1038.] Vermont law also states that you may be billed for search and rescue activities for your rescue.



Woods Skiing and Riding: \*Open and designated trails at the Quechee Ski Area are generally within the groomed edges of trails.

\*All other areas, including woods that are accessible from the Quechee Ski Area facilities, are not part of the designated trails.

\*If you choose to ski/ride in the woods (or in other non-designated areas), please know that these areas are not opened, closed, inspected, marked, or patrolled in any way by the Quechee Ski Area.

\*The woods (and other non-designated areas) will contain countless hazards and can be life-threatening, including the possibility of being severely injured in remote locations and/ or becoming lost and freezing to death. Search and rescue operations are conducted in Vermont woods each winter for lost skiers and riders who choose to leave the designated terrain and ski or ride in the woods. These searches are not always successful.

\*If you do choose to ski or ride in the woods, or otherwise leave the designated trails, please be sure you are prepared to endure extreme conditions. Never ski or ride in the woods alone and never enter the woods after 3pm in the afternoon.

**SLEDDING** Sledding can be a dangerous sport and all who participate do so at their own risk. Many hidden obstacles can exist, and all participants should sled in control at all times to avoid collisions. Children should be supervised by an adult, and the conditions should be considered carefully prior to sledding. Sleds with some form of steering are suggested for safety reasons over tubes and other equipment that have limited steering ability.

The designated sledding area is the hill behind The Base Lodge on the 18th fairway of the Highland golf course. This area is the only one which is maintained for sledding during daylight hours. Please sled only inside the fenced, groomed area.

Sledding is expressly prohibited on The Ski Hill slopes and trails at all times, both day and night, whether the ski area is open or closed.

Nightime sledding is also prohibited on all QLLA properties unless in an organized event sponsored by QLLA.

There are no sled rentals available at QLLA.

**SNOWSHOEING** If snowshoeing in the Cross Country areas, please do so outside of the groomed tracks, and avoid crossing greens/tees on the golf course.

There are many trails in Section 5 available for the wilderness experience. Please avoid the groomed ski tracks here as well. Going alone is not recommended, but if you do, at least let someone know where you are going and when you anticipate returning. Section 5 is not patrolled and the woods can be a cold and lonely place if you get hurt or lost. Maps are available at Membership Services or The Base Lodge and are posted on trees throughout the area.
