



Your Responsibility Code

Skiing can be enjoyed in many ways. At a ski area, you may see people using alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross-country and other specialized ski equipment, such as that used by disabled or other skiers. Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes, always show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk in skiing that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Observe the code listed below and share with other skiers the responsibility for a great skiing experience.

- Always stay in control, and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
- People ahead of you have the right of way. It's your responsibility to avoid them.
- You must not stop where you obstruct a trail, or are not visible from above.
- Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.

NOTICE: The Inherent Risk of Skiing

No skier (any person present in a ski area for the purpose of engaging in the sport of skiing, Nordic, freestyle, or other types of ski jumping, using skis, sled, tube snowboard or any other device) shall make any claim against, or recover from any ski area operator for injury resulting from any of the inherent risks of skiing, which means those dangers or conditions which are an integral

Be aware that snowmaking and/or snowworking (where applicable) may be in progress. If you cannot accept the inherent risks of the sport, please do not ski at this area.

Remember to always ski safely, within control.

Solitude Safety Tips

1. Symbols and color codes indicate the relative skiing difficulty on trails on THIS mountain and may be steeper and/or require more advanced skiing skills than trails with the same markings at other areas. If you are unfamiliar with Solitude, start with easier trails first and do not start down a trail or run until you know its degree of difficulty.
2. In case of an accident, place crossed skis upright in the snow at the scene of the accident and notify the operator at the bottom of any lift.
3. Skiing beyond a "Closed-Avalanche Danger" sign is a violation of

Salt Lake County ordinance 913, section 22, and can result in a fine and/or jail.

4. Skiers swinging their chairs or jumping from lifts will forfeit lift pass and can result in a fine and/or jail.
5. You, the skier, choose how and where you ski. For your safety, and that of your fellow skiers, be aware of changing trail conditions.
6. When skiing in Honeycomb Canyon or Sol/Bright, skiers should look for big letters (A through Z) or big numbers (1-20) that are attached to trees. If you have to report an accident, please note the letter closest to the problem. This will hasten the patrol response time.

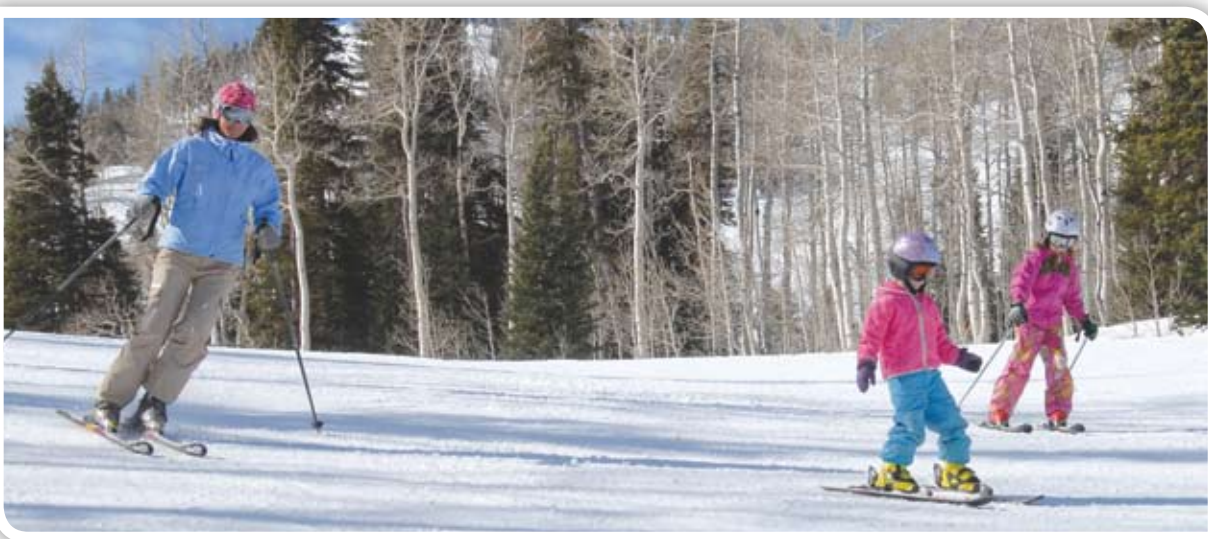


RESTAURANTS AS TEMPTING

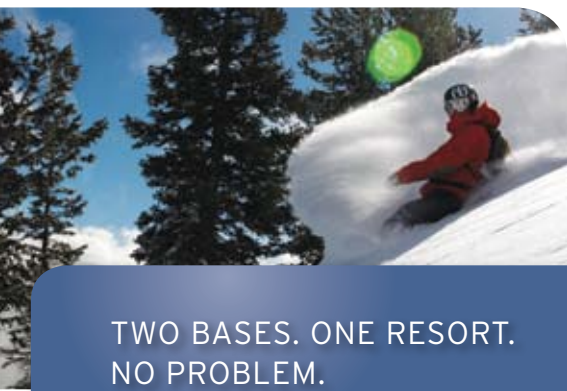

Add to your Solitude experience with any or all of these great adventures – on and off the mountain.

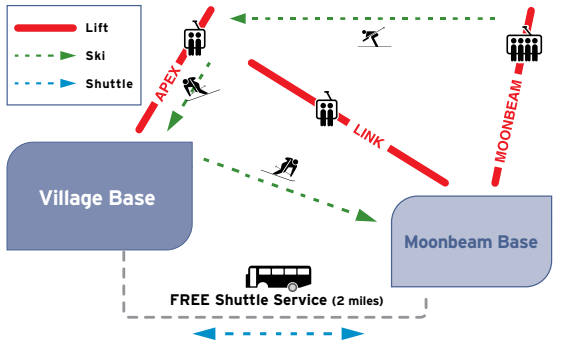
