

Terrain Parks - Two freestyle terrain areas exist on the mountain and are designated on this map with an orange oval. They may contain jumps, hits, rails, ramps, berms, fun boxes, jibs, snowcross, and other constructed or natural terrain features. Prior to using this terrain, you are responsible for familiarizing yourself with the terrain and obeying all signs and warnings. Use of this terrain exposes you to risk of serious injury or death. Inverted aerials are not recommended.

- Beginner Park (located on Miami Beach) With small terrain features to practice skills.
- Advanced Park (located on Hancock/Continental) Featuring intermediate and advanced level rails and jumps.

This cooperative effort between Red Lodge Mountain Resort, the U.S. Forest Service, and the Beartooth Resource and Conservation District will open the forest canopy through the selective removal of trees, including standing dead trees. In addition to allowing the resort's timber stands to better resist the destructive effects of pine beetles and other invasive insects, the thinning will reduce fuel loads to better

The project will take several years to fully complete, and is taking place on both private Red Lodge Mountain Resort land and U.S.

withstand forest fire, while creating new skiable terrain.



Safety Info

Ski Patrol - The First Aid Station is located in the lower level of the Main Lodge. There are also Ski Patrol Stations at the Grizzly Peak Summit, Cole Creek Summit and at the top of the Triple Chair.

In Case of an Accident - If you are witness to or are involved in an accident, stay on the scene. Place your skis in a cross above the scene and report the incident to any uniformed employee.

Caution - Snowcats, snowmobiles and snowmaking equipment may be encountered on the trails at any time.

Slow Areas - Some areas and runs are designated as Slow Areas. Please observe these posted signs and maintain a speed no faster than the general flow of traffic.

Varying Conditions - As with all outdoor activities, weather conditions may change at any time. Please keep this in mind when skiing and snowboarding. It is best to ski with a partner, especially in the trees. Obey all signs and warnings.

Skier's and Snowboarder's Responsibility Code

- Always stay in control, and be able to stop or avoid other people or
- People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- You must not stop where you obstruct a trail, or are not visible from above.
- Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.
- If witness to or involved in an accident, alert Ski Patrol and remain on scene.
- Do not use lifts or trails if under the influence of alcohol or drugs
 Ski Area Boundaries The Ski Area Boundary is defined by signs and/or rope lines. Red Lodge Mountain Resort does not patrol beyond

these areas and is not responsible for any avalanche control beyond this line. Any rescues beyond this boundary will be made through the Carbon County Sheriff's Department (406-446-1234) and you will be charged for the rescue. Please respect all closures for your own safety. Failure to do so will result in the loss of pass or lift ticket.

Montana Skier Responsibility Act

Montana State Law Section 23-2-736, MCA

Duties of a Skier

(1) A skier has the duty to ski at all times in a manner that avoids injury to the skier and others and to be aware of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing. (2) A skier:

(a) shall know the range of the skier's ability and safely ski within the limits of that ability and the skier's equipment so as to negotiate any section of terrain or ski slope and trail safely and without injury or damage. A skier shall know that the skier's ability may vary because of ski slope and trail changes caused by weather, grooming changes, or skier use.

- (b) Shall maintain control of speed and course so as to prevent injury to the skier or others:
- (c) Shall abide by the requirements of the skier responsibility code that is published by the national ski areas association and that is posted as provided in 23-2-733;

- (d) Shall obey all posted or other warnings and instructions of the ski area operator; and
- (e) Shall read the ski area trail map and must be aware of its contents.

 (3) A person may not:
- (a) Place an object in the ski area or on the uphill track of a passenger ropeway that may cause a passenger or skier to fall:
- (b) Cross the track of a passenger ropeway except at a designated and approved
- (c) If involved in a skiing accident, depart from the scene of the accident without:
 (i) Leaving personal identification; or
- (ii) Notifying the proper authorities and obtaining assistance when the person knows that a person involved in the accident is in need of medical or other assistance.
- (4) A skier shall accept all legal responsibility for injury or damage of any kind to the extent that the injury or damage results from inherent dangers and risks of skiing. Nothing in this part may be construed to limit a skier's right to hold another skier legally accountable for damages caused by the other skier.
